FURTHER DETAILS

ANNUAL ESSAYS

- Essays are treated as every other course – it means that not having grades from essays by the end of September is equal to **not passing the year** of studies. Passing condition from an essay is **chargeable**
- You also have to **register** for annual essays in USOS
- Student can write annual/semester essay under the supervision of a **teacher** who teaches a course that student attends in a given year.

OGUNS (GENERAL UNIVERSITY SUBJECTS)

- You can pass any class that appears as “OGUN” in the USOS – **except** those OGUNs that are offered by the Institute of Philosophy (shortly, OGUNs have to be passed “outside”).
- It is highly recommended to choose OGUNs that are in English, however, it is allowed to take OGUNs in Polish (and any other language).
- If you study also at some other faculty, subjects included in the programme of studies of that faculty **cannot** be counted as OGUNs within the philosophy programme.
- What matters in case of OGUNs are **ECTS** points – not hours. You have to collect the designated number of ECTS point during the studies (the number differs for different programmes). Numbers of hours in the programme of studies are just suggestions how long it usually take to collect the required number of ECTS points.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES COURSES

- **Passing the exam and passing the foreign language courses are separate things. It means that if you have passed the exam-requirement (by passing the university exam or submitting external certificate) you still have to fulfil the requirement of collecting 8 ECTS points from foreign language courses.**
- Student can choose any foreign language to learn provided that it is **not English and/or student’s mother tongue**.
- Foreigners who do not speak **Polish** are obliged to choose Polish course.
- Student is obliged to pass 240 hours and 8 ECTS points throughout **first five** semesters of studies.
- There is no rule saying that it has to be the same language every semester — technically student can change language group each semester.

THE FINAL EXAM IN FOREIGN LANGUAGE

- Student is obliged to pass the exam after the **fifth semester** or earlier
- The exam does not have to be in the language learnt during foreign language courses (you can e.g. pass Icelandic, while attending Italian courses)
- Student has to pass the exam on **at least B2 level**.

MISCELLANEOUS

- (Intellectual Property Law, Health and Safety, Information Technologies) are treated as other subjects and not passing any of them is equal to not passing the semester or year.
- No main subjects (ie. philosophical courses) can be passed in Polish. The fact that you have access to registration for subjects in Polish means that you are entitled to attend them, but none of the courses in Polish may be counted as passing any requirement of the programme of studies in English.
- That student can pass **seminar instead of monographic lecture, but not vice versa**, is a general rule.
- Student is obliged to pass 120 hours of Physical Education classes before the end of the **fifth semester**.
